Market and commercial females will need to be tagged at spring weigh-in to be able to show at the Greenwood County Fair. If you have purebred animals that have registration papers they will not be required to be tagged, but you must turn in a copy of those registration papers to the Extension Office by the spring Small Animal weigh-in date. You may email them to Ben (benjam63@ksu.edu). All livestock must be castrated or banded by spring weigh-in.

New This Year! Dairy Goats at the County Fair!



We are happy to announce that there will be a Dairy Goat Division at the 2024 Greenwood County Fair. Detailed show rules will be released in the Fair Book on June 1st. Animals must be dehorned and debudded. Does must be ADGA or AGS regis-

tered. Registration papers or stamped duplicate registration applications will be required for all registered animals. Animal papers must be in the name of the 4-Hers by June 1 or show ownership by June 1 for grades. Each exhibitor is limited to 4 entries for the entire dairy goat show, with a max of 2 entries per age division (i.e. 2 Jr Does and 2 Sr. Does). Animals without registration papers or legible tattoos, will show with recorded grades, on a bill of sale. Those animals must also be identified by an official USDA Scrapie Premise I.D. tag. Horse Judging Camp & Contest

Kansas 4-H, Kansas Quarter Horse Association, and EquiFest of Kansas are teaming up to host the 2024 Kansas State 4-H Horse Judging Contest. The Contest will be held March 14, 2024, in conjunction with EquiFest of Kansas in Salina. Two contests are available- an open contest and a 4-H contest. Kansas 4-H members age 9-18 are invited to participate in the 4-H contest, and may also participate in the open contest. Youth of any age are eligible to participate in the open contest hosted by Kansas Quarter Horse Association. Cost to enter the first contest is \$15. Registration for both contests is \$25. Coaches should register teams and individuals here. Registration closes March 8th. Please be sure to read all rules prior to entry- 4-H Horse Judging rules.

Leaders' Notes

- ◆ Volunteer Screening: If you know of any 4-H volunteers that have not registered and gone through the screening process, please let the office know immediately! The Extension Office wishes to ensure that ALL Greenwood County 4-H Volunteers, both new and old, have gone through the appropriate steps of screening to be 4-H Volunteers. Per the Kansas 4-H Policy Handbook: It is a privilege, not a right, to be a 4-H Volunteer. These volunteers are expected to adhere to the Kansas 4-H Code of Conduct found HERE. New volunteers must complete the initial steps of: 4-H Online profile creation, References, Criminal Background Check, Interview, Orientation, and Approval before they can serve as a 4-H Volunteer. All information must be kept current in the 4-H Online system. A Kansas 4-H Volunteer is defined as any "Adult providing direct supervision to youth at a 4-H program; making decisions on behalf of the 4-H program; having access to private data of 4-H youths or volunteers; and/or handling funds as part of 4-H and must complete the volunteer screening process, be accepted, and enrolled as a KS 4-H Volunteer." We need your help as leaders to ensure we are completing screening for all volunteers. Current volunteers should go through a rerunning of a Criminal Background Check every three years.
- Kansas Maid Fundraiser: Orders are due to Extension Office by 4:30pm on Friday, March 1st. Please have checks made payable to your club. Leaders please turn in your club's orders together on one form and with one check from your club for the total amount due for all orders. Tentative pickup date is Friday, March 22nd.
- ♦ Beef weigh-in: Friday, March 15th noon to 5pm at Luthi's, 3673 Z Rd, Madison. Beef Tag's are \$4.00. All youth with livestock will be required to have a signed copy of the Premium Sale Rules on file in order to sell their animal. Required signatures will be from both the 4-H'er and their guardian. This will be completed at each Spring weighin.
- ♦ County Fair 4-H Archery and Shotgun Shoots: For this year only, the county fair shooting sports events will not be on their normal weekend. The schedules will stay the same. The new dates are: Archery Contest Saturday June 22nd, Shotgun shoot Sunday, June 23rd, and Shooting Sports Banquet Sunday, June 23rd. The banquet will be at the Concourse Building at the fairgrounds. Shooting sports entries will be due on June 14th in Fair Entry
