- Develop college and career readiness skills which prepare participants academically and socially for a successful transition to college and life as an adult



Horse ID Papers

Horse ID's are due in the Extension Office by Thursday, June 1st. Get one <u>here</u> or pick one up at the Extension Office.

The Kansas 4-H horse rule book may be found here.

- ⇒ Horse Ownership: Youth may own the horse themselves, or use a family-owned horse (immediate family: parent, stepparent, sibling, grandparent, or legal guardian).
- ⇒ Leasing: The leasing option is intended for youth who do not have access to family-owned horse or who want to expand their participation in the 4-H Horse Project, provided that they manage the horse at least 75% of the time from June 1 through September 30. If a 4-H member leases his or her project horse to another 4-H member, the leaser forfeits the right to use the horse.
- ⇒ Sharing Project Horses: The names of all siblings who intend to show the horse must be listed on the 4-H Horse Identification submitted on or before June 1st. Youth may exhibit the same horse; however the horse cannot participate in the same class in the same age division more than once at a given show. Youth can be in same age division, but they will have to participate in different classes. Youth must share management of the horse.

Horse Judging Camp & Contest

The State 4-H Horse Judging is scheduled for Thursday, June 15th at the Saline County Livestock & Expo Center in Salina, KS. The KSU Horse Judging Camp will be held prior to judging on June 13th & 14th on Campus. The Advanced session will be on the 13th & 14th, with a beginner session on the 14th. The camp is open to 4-H and non 4-H members. 4-Hers will then be able to use these skills and apply them on Thursday for the judging contest. Registration for both the camp and the contest is expected to be released in April. Information will be posted on the webpage at <u>https://www.kansas4-h.org/events-</u> activities/contests/horse-judging/index.html.

Entomology Project Meeting

Greenwood County Fair Photography Special Category Award

- 1. Photography judging will be on Saturday, July 22nd starting at 8am. Horse show participates will be judged first.
- Do <u>not</u> label your exhibit. Superintendent will place label on exhibits when they are brought in for judging. Keep your bags unsealed.
- Kim Gaines will be sponsoring a photo category "4-H Spirit Photography Special Category Award." One (1) color entry per 4-H member (needs to be enrolled in the photography project) that depicts the spirit and promotion of the 4-H organization. A \$20.00 cash prize will be awarded.

Guidelines are:

- Photos could be selected to go to the state fair under the color category.
- If entering your color photo in the special award there will be a sticker to apply to your entry.
- This is a one winner category.
- All members would acknowledge that the GWCO Extension and Research office and/or ambassadors would use these photos for publication and promotion.
- Upon being selected for these possible projects, a digital file will need to be submitted to the extension office at a later date.
- The photo would not be eligible for open class.
- This would not increase the number of photos a 4-H member could enter at the county level.

4-H/FFA Fair Premium Sale Policy Reminders

This policy is regarding eligibility for the Livestock Sale from the Greenwood County 4-H Foundation:

- Livestock sale participants are required to attend a minimum of 4 monthly meetings.
- The livestock sale is terminal for all animals. Grand and Reserve Grand in each species are required to sell. Fair participants will be limited to one animal in the sale with the exception that in the event that a participant has more than one Grand and/or Reserve Champion, the participant will be required to sell ALL Grand and/or Reserve Champions.
- Requiring all Grand and Reserve Champions to sell ensures the quality and integrity of the program.
- Each fair participant has the right to withdraw their animal from the grand drive if they wish not to sell it.

For questions, contact Jamie Nelson, President of Greenwood County 4-H Foundation. Other members include Mike Mallek, Natalie Boone, Sarah Luthi, Alan Johnson, and Luke Westerman.

Each 4-H member who wishes to sell an animal in Greenwood County 4-H Premium sale must:

- Attend at least four monthly meetings of the club in which they are enrolled. Attendance will be counted from October 1st - June 30th; with the official record being the 4-H club Secretary.
- 2. Have a signed copy (both 4-H'er and guardian must sign) of the GW Co Fair Livestock Premium Sale Rules on file with the Extension Office by **June 1st!**

NEW 4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for Frostings & Fillings at the KSF

Please note that there is a **NEW** 4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for the 2023 Kansas State Fair. The new rule is as follows:

⇒ For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. GREENWOOD COUNTY 4-H FAVORITE FOOD SHOW FRIDAY, JUNE 2, 2023 @ 2:00 PM GREENWOOD COUNTY COURTHOUSE



Favorite Food Show is an exhibit and contest to encourage 4-H'ers to learn about meal planning, food preparation, and presentation. This is a creative and fun event for 4-Hers. A "Favorite Food" is chosen, and is recommended that it is one the 4-H'er likes and likes to prepare. A menu is planned with the food, and the table decor is coordinated. Foods chosen may be main courses, desserts, snacks, breads, casseroles or any other. A recipe card and a menu card should be displayed with the proper table setting. The 4-Her will visit informally with the judge and tell how to prepare and serve the food, why they selected the table service and dishes, and why the centerpiece is appropriate. The 4-Her should also know some of the nutritional value of the food and be able to discuss that with the judge.

There are no hard and fast rules, but the following score card is suggested:

30 points - The Exhibitor

- Appropriately dressed for the occasion of the menu, Originality
- Interview-eye contact, Clarity, Volume of voice
- Demonstrates understanding of table setting techniques and the menu, food preparation, and food safety

30 points - The Food

- Can discuss Nutritional Value & Health Portions
- Understands preparations of the food item
- Appearance of food
- Food safety knowledge
- Portion size

20 points - The Menu With Favorite Food

- Appropriate food choices
- Understanding of meal preparation time management
- Knowledge and experience with this menu
- Balanced in color and texture

20 points - The Table Setting

- Appropriate for menu
- Menu and recipe are clear and legible
- Attractive-color scheme, dishes, food, placemats, linen, etc.
- Appropriate centerpiece
