Consultation Judging Changes

When and how indoor projects are judged will look a little different this year. All projects except for Agronomy and Horticulture will be judged consultation style. What this means is that youth will sign up for time slots to sit down with a judge, have their exhibits evaluated, and receive feedback from that judge on their exhibit. This is the same as how Visual Arts, Photography, Clothing, Fiber Arts, and Foods have been done in the past. This consultation judging will be done on the Saturday (19th) before the fair in the Concourse building. Clothing will remain on the same day, as well as foods and visual arts. Consultation judging is not required, but strongly encouraged, as we believe the feedback from the judges will benefit our youth. Even if a youth does not partake in consultation judging, their exhibits must be brought to the respective judging day or their exhibit will not be judged. We realize this change may be a large adjustment for some, so please feel free to reach out to Alisha or Ben with questions.

Greenwood County Fair Photography Special Category Award

- 1. Photography judging will be on Saturday, July 19th starting at 8am. Sign-ups will be on a first come first serve basis in SignUpGenius. If you ae exhibiting in the Horse Show please plan accordingly.
- 2. Do **not** label your exhibit. Superintendent will place label on exhibits when they are brought in for judging. Keep your bags unsealed.
- 3. Kim Gaines will be sponsoring a photo category "4-H Spirit Photography Special Category Award." One (1) color entry per 4-H member (needs to be enrolled in the photography project) that depicts the spirit and promotion of the 4-H organization. A \$20.00 cash prize will be awarded.

Guidelines are:

- Photos could be selected to go to the state fair under the color category.
- If entering your color photo in the special award there will be a sticker to apply to your entry.
- This is a one winner category.
- All members would acknowledge that the GWCO Extension and Research office and/or ambassadors would use these photos for publication and promo-
- Upon being selected for these possible projects, a digital file will need to be submitted to the extension office at a later date.
- The photo would not be eligible for open class.
- This would not increase the number of photos a 4-H member could enter at the county level.

4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for Frostings & Fillings at the GW Co Fair & KSF

Please note that there was new rule for 4-H Foods & Nutrition changed last year. The new rule is as follows:

⇒ For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings & fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting & fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. 4-H/FFA Fair Premium Sale **Policy Reminders**

This policy is regarding eligibility for the Livestock Sale from the Greenwood County 4-H Foundation:

- · Livestock sale participants are required to attend a minimum of 4 monthly meetings.
- The livestock sale is terminal for all animals. Grand and Reserve Grand in each species are required to sell. Fair participants will be limited to one animal in the sale with the exception that in the event that a participant has more than one Grand and/or Reserve Champion, the participant will be required to sell ALL Grand and/or Reserve Champions.
- Requiring all Grand and Reserve Champions to sell ensures the quality and integrity of the program.
- Each fair participant has the right to withdraw their animal from the grand drive if they wish not to sell it.

Each 4-H member who wishes to sell an animal in Greenwood County 4-H Premium sale must:

- 1. Attend at least four monthly meetings of the club in which they are enrolled. Attendance will be counted from October 1st - June 30th; with the official record being the 4-H club Secretary.
- 2. Have a signed copy (both 4-H'er and guardian must sign) of the GW Co Fair Livestock Premium Sale Rules on file with the Extension Office by May 30th!

This is an agriculture skill-a-thon competition for 4-H & FFA youth ages 16-18 as of January 1st of this year. The competition will be held on Monday, July 28th from 2-3 pm in the Concourse Building. Those wishing to compete must complete an entry form and submit it to either 4-H Foundation President, Jamie Nelson or Ag Agent, Ben Sims by **Noon** on Sunday, July 27th. The winner will have the opportunity to go on to compete for one of two \$2,250 scholarships at the Challenge of Champions hosted by the Kansas Fairs & Festivals Association at the Kansas State Fair on September 7th.















Leader's Notes

- ♦ <u>Ambassador Program:</u> Please encourage your high school age members to be thinking about applying to be an 4-H Ambassador. Applications will be due September 2nd.
- <u>FairEntry:</u> Opens June 1st, Closes July 1st! Special note that Shooting Sports entries are due June 13th.
- Small Livestock & Commercial Heifers Nominations: must be post-marked by June 15th
- Poultry Testing and Banding: Testing is required for all birds that exhibit at the fair this year. Testing and banding will be held on the fairgrounds June 26 @ 5:30 pm. If families cannot make it that night, then they still need to make arrangements for their birds to be brought.
- Horse Coggins: All horse show exhibitors must show proof of a negative EIA Coggins test for each horse in order to exhibit.
- ♦ Horse Showmanship and Trail Clinics: Cindy Hayes will be hosting a showmanship clinic on June 18th and trail class clinic on June 25th. Both at the Saddle Club Arena starting at 5:30 pm.
- <u>State Horse Show:</u> If you have families wishing to exhibit at the State 4-H Horse Show, entries are due by August 1st. Also, all qualifications need to be completed by that time.
- Fair Changes: Please be sure to direct your members to the County Fair changes for this year that can be found <u>HERE</u>. Specifically note the date change for judging of indoor exhibits to Saturday the 19th. Being in-person for consultation judging is not required. However, the exhibits still need to be dropped off at the proper date, time, and location so that they can be judged.
- <u>Consultation Sign-Ups</u>: Sign-ups for judging spots will be the same as in years past and done via Sign Up Genius via a link families will receive via email.

Please encourage your families to not wait until the last minute to complete their County Fair entries. If they are having issues, they can reach out to us. We would rather help a family with an issue instead of them not being able to show at the fair.

- 1.) Contestants must be at least 16 years of age but not over 18 years of age as of January 1, current year.
- 2.) There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion of the competition. The Champion will have the opportunity to compete at the Kansas State Fair Challenge of Champions in September that is hosted by the Kansas Fairs & Festivals Association. That Champion has until August 5th to decide if they will compete. Should they choose not to, then the Reserve Champion will serve as an alternate and have the opportunity to go on and compete.
- 3.) The Superintendent of the contest, in cooperation with the contest committee, will be in charge of the contest. They shall have the authority for the interpretation of the policies.
- 4.) The contestants will be furnished with placing cards and any other necessary forms. No contestant will be allowed to have books, notes, pamphlets, phones, or electric devices out during the contest.
- 5.) While contest is in session there shall be **no communication** among contestants or anyone other than the facilitator of the competition.
