Static Entry Cards

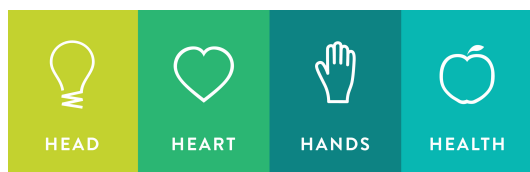

Consultation Judging

Indoor projects will be judged through consultation judging again this year. All projects except for Agronomy and Horticulture will be judged consultation style. Youth will sign up for time slots to sit down with a judge, have their exhibits evaluated, and receive feedback from that judge on their exhibit. This is the same as how Visual Arts, Photography, Clothing, Fiber Arts, and Foods have been done in the past. Consultation judging will be done on the Saturday (18th) before the fair in the Concourse building. Clothing will remain on the same day (Wednesday), as well as foods and visual arts (Friday). Consultation judging is not required, but strongly encouraged, as we believe the feedback from the judges will benefit our youth. **Even if 4-H'er does not participate in consultation judging, their exhibits must be brought to the respective judging day or their exhibit will not be judged.** If you have questions please reach out to Alisha or Clinton.

4-H/FFA Fair Premium Sale Policy Reminders

This policy is regarding eligibility for the Livestock Sale from the Greenwood County 4-H Foundation:

- Livestock sale participants are required to attend a minimum of 4 monthly meetings.
- The livestock sale is terminal for all animals. Grand and Reserve Grand in each species are required to sell. Fair participants will be limited to one animal in the sale **with the exception that in the event that a participant has more than one Grand and/or Reserve Champion, the participant will be required to sell ALL Grand and/or Reserve Champions.**
- Requiring all Grand and Reserve Champions to sell ensures the quality and integrity of the program.
- Each fair participant has the right to withdraw their animal from the grand drive if they wish not to sell it.

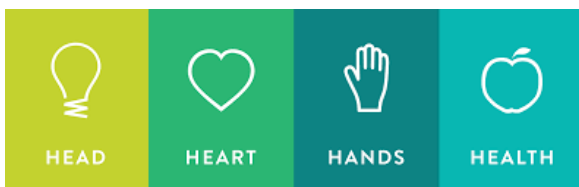

Each 4-H member who wishes to sell an animal in Greenwood County 4-H Premium sale must:

1. Attend at least four monthly meetings of the club in which they are enrolled. Attendance will be counted from October 1st - June 30th; with the official record being the 4-H Club Secretary.
2. Have a signed copy (both 4-H'er and guardian must sign) of the Greenwood County Fair Livestock Premium Sale Rules on file with the Extension Office.

Bedding Livestock at the Fair

Please feed hay when you have the animal out of the barn. Tie-out time is 8:30pm. Please have your animal on display until this time. We work hard at keeping our barn area clean. Try to keep you "tie-out" area clean as well. The last day of the fair, clean up extra hay and any spilled grain. Beef, lamb, goats, and swine are bedded in wood shavings. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to clean up after their livestock. Bedding will be provided for Beef animals. There will be bedding available for Sheep and Goat entries should you want to use it. Bedding is mulch type. There is no cost for bedding. The use of straw is not allowed.



Fair Horse Show - July 18th at 5pm

The 4-H Horse show rule book will be followed. Show management and/or the judge may modify class execution as appropriate to run the show as efficiently as possible and allow you to exhibit their project to the best of their abilities. Please remember to wear long sleeves, collar shirt/blouses, unless advised differently at the horse show.

- Original Horse ID papers & negative Coggins test required
- Bring buckets to water horses as the weather most likely will be very warm
- Listen to announcements before Trail, Working Ranch Horse and times events

IMPORTANT LIVESTOCK NOTES

- With Fair time quickly approaching please remember that we need all sheep and goats to be sheered slick by weigh in time on Friday, July 24th. As stated in the Fair Book, animals that are not sheered will not be weighed!
- Each exhibitor must groom his or her own animal. The exhibitor may have assistance only from a Greenwood County 4-H livestock leader or FFA advisor. The exhibitor's immediate family or other Greenwood County 4-H or FFA members.
- Exhibitors need to wear a nice shirt or a current Greenwood County Fair T-shirt to show or sell livestock.
- Superintendents will have livestock pens labeled for each family. **Due to the large number of livestock entries, some sheep exhibitors will be assigned to swine pens.**
- **Tack space will be limited**, so please keep supplies organized and stored safely out of reach of other livestock. Be sure all items are kept clear of walkways.
- Superintendents will have more information at the livestock exhibitor meeting on Friday, July 24th @ 11:30 AM.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we all share this space during the fair!

Fair Clothing Judging Wednesday, July 22nd in Madison

Good luck on judging Wednesday, July 22nd at the Madison High School! Please enter through the Commons Area of the school, where registration will be held (south doors). The Public Fashion Revue is scheduled to begin at 7pm that evening. **4-Her's will sign up for judging times via Sign-up Genius.** The schedule will be posted that day in the Commons Area.

Practice Walk Through:

This will be July 20th from 5-6 pm, and is a time for younger members to come and ask questions about judging day and public style revue.

Here's some reminders for the day:

1. Arrive early - get everything you might need together the evening prior to the event.
2. Smile, Smile, Smile! Prepare ahead and relax to have a positive day.
3. Plan ahead - press and iron your clothes, fix your hair prior to coming to save time.
4. You will need one time slot for Shopping In Style and multiple for Style Revue to coincide with the number of outfits to be modeled.

Public Fashion Revue Reminders:

- Clothing information sheet, with public revue script, should have been left with judge that morning.
- Model only 2 outfits total (see fair book)
- Agent will contact parent with top outfit(s) to model if there are more than 2 options - youth are not required to wear those outfits but are encouraged to
- Line-up begins at 6:45pm near dressing rooms from judging
- Sewing & Textile Design Fashion Revue winners will also be announced at the Public Fashion Revue.
- There will be a reserved seating area for 4-H'ers when they finish their fashion revue
- Modeling can be done in groups no larger than 4 exhibitors

Submitting Clothing at the Fair:

- Submit Clothing entries at the Fair on wire hangers with static entry card and cost per wear form attached.

Greenwood County Fair Photography Special Category Award

1. Photography judging will be on Saturday, July 18th starting at 8am.
2. Do **not** label your exhibit. Superintendent will place label on exhibits when they are brought in for judging. Keep your bags unsealed.
3. Kim Gaines will be sponsoring a photo category "4-H Spirit Photography Special Category Award." One color entry per 4-H member (needs to be enrolled in the photography project) that depicts the spirit and promotion of the 4-H organization. A \$20.00 cash prize will be awarded.

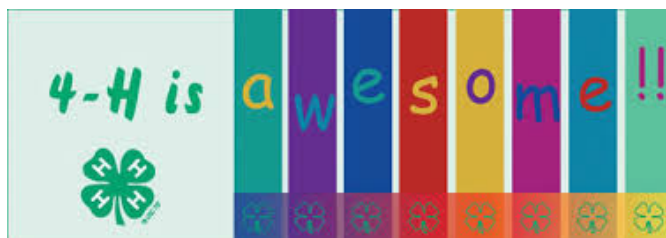
Guidelines are:

- Photos could be selected to go to the state fair under the color category.
- If entering your color photo in the special award there will be a sticker to apply to your entry.
- This is a one winner category.
- All members would acknowledge that the GW County Extension office and/or ambassadors would use these photos for publication and promotion.
- Upon being selected for these possible projects, a digital file will need to be submitted to the extension office at a later date.
- The photo would not be eligible for open class.
- This would not increase the number of photos a 4-H member could enter at the county level.

4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for Frostings & Fillings at the GW Co Fair & KSF

Please note the rule concerning frostings and fillings. The rule is as follows:

- For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings & fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting & fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. Challenge of Champions

This is an agriculture skill-a-thon competition for 4-H & FFA youth ages 16-18 as of January 1st of this year. The competition will be held on Monday, July 27 from 2-3pm in the Concourse Building. Those wishing to compete must complete an entry form and submit it to either 4-H Foundation President, Jamie Nelson or Ag Agent, Clinton Laflin by **noon** on Sunday, July 26. Entry forms and competition rules can be found at the end of this newsletter. The winner will have the opportunity to go on to compete for one of two \$2,250 scholarships at the Challenge of Champions hosted by the Kansas Fairs & Festivals Association at the Kansas State Fair on September 20th.

Greenwood County 4-H Carcass Contest

The 4-H Carcass Contest involving market beef, market swine, market goats, and market lambs is planned for this year's fair. Ideally, animals that place 1st and 2nd in market animal classes will be included in this contest. The date to view the carcasses at Woodson County Prime Meats in Yates Center and Olpe Locker will be emailed out at a later date. The Carcass Contest Results Meeting date will be announced shortly. Exhibitors are encouraged to attend the viewing for their carcass animals. 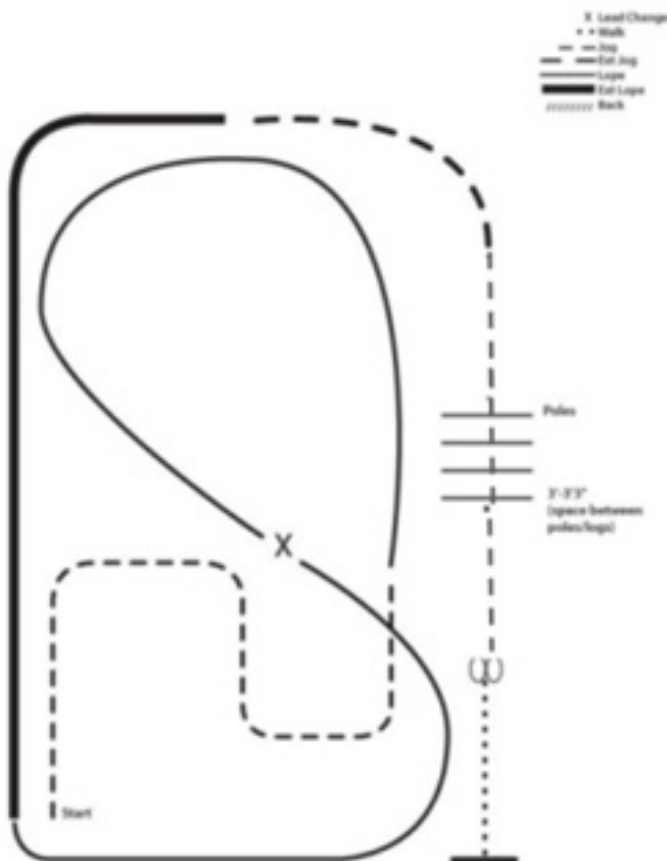
Come be a 4-H Ambassador!

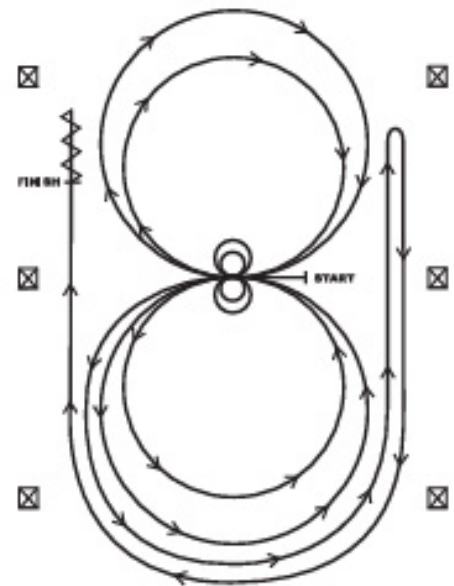
Fair Horse Show Patterns

Working Ranch Pattern 4



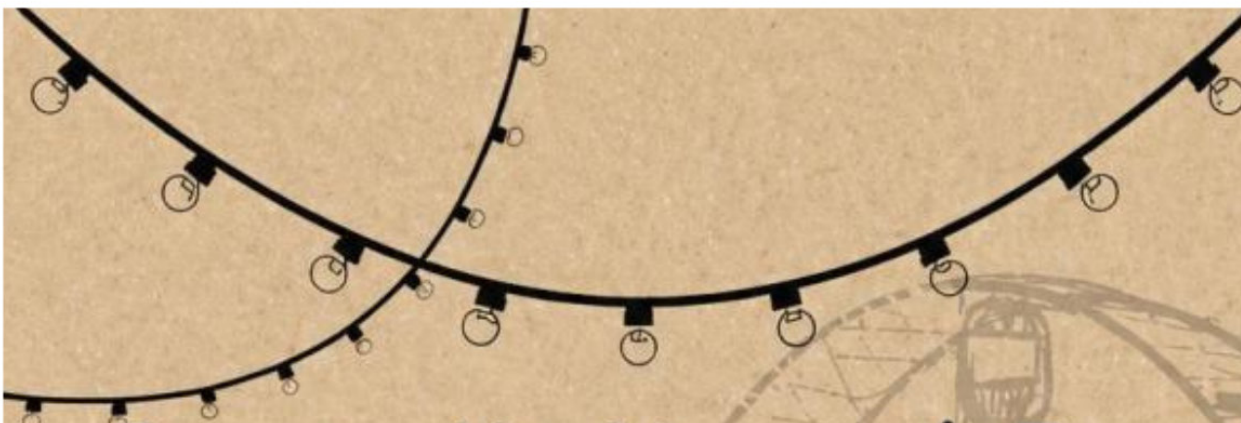
1. Jog serpentine
2. Lope left lead around the end of the arena and then diagonally across the arena
3. Change leads (simple or flying) and lope on the right lead around end of the arena
4. Extend lope straight away and around corner to the center of the arena
5. Extend jog around corner of the arena
6. Collect to a jog, jog over poles
7. Stop, do 360° turn each direction (either direction first)
8. Walk

Reining Pattern I



Mandatory Marker Along Fence or Wall

1. Walk or jog to the center of the arena. Horse must stop prior to starting the pattern.
2. Complete two spins to the left. Hesitate.
3. Complete two circles to the left on the left lead; first circle should be large and fast, the second circle small and slow. Change leads.
4. Complete two circles to the right on the right lead; first circle should be large and fast, the second circle small and slow. Stop at the center of the arena and hesitate.
5. Complete two spins to the right. Hesitate.
6. On the left lead, go around the end of the arena, run down the side past the center marker. Stop and roll back right.
7. Continue around the end of the arena to run down the side past the center marker. Stop and back.

General Rules

- 1 Contestants must be at least 16 years of age but not over 18 years of age as of January 1, current year.
- 2 There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion of the competition. The Champion will have the opportunity to compete at the Kansas State Fair Challenge of Champions in September that is hosted by the Kansas Fairs & Festivals Association. That Champion has until August 5th to decide if they will compete. Should they choose not to, then the Reserve Champion will serve as an alternate and have the opportunity to go on and compete.
- 3 The Superintendent of the contest, in cooperation with the contest committee, will be in charge of the contest. They shall have the authority for the interpretation of the policies.
- 4 The contestants will be furnished with placing cards and any other necessary forms. No contestant will be allowed to have books, notes, pamphlets, phones, or electric devices out during the contest.
- 5 While contest is in session there shall be **no communication** among contestants or anyone other than the facilitator of the competition.

4-H CLUB LEADERS NOTES

FairEntry: Closes July 1st!

Public Fashion Revue: ALL clubs are asked to provide 4 dozen cookies for refreshments after the public fashion revue in the evening. Please drop off your cookies between 8:00 AM and noon at the Madison High School Area.

4-H Online Emails: Please make sure your families are receiving emails from our office. If they have a different email preference than what is on 4-H Online please tell them to update it with us. We have had several issues lately with families not getting important information through email because we don't have the preferred email address.

Horse Identification: Please remind members wishing to show at the County Fair that registration papers are no longer accepted as forms of ID. It must be the Horse ID form. Also, all exhibitors must show proof of a negative EIA Coggins test for each horse.

Consultation Judging: Sign-ups for judging spots will be the same as in years past and done via SignUpGenius links emailed to families. Being in-person for consultation judging is not required. However, exhibits still need to be dropped off at the proper date, time, and location so that they can be judged.
